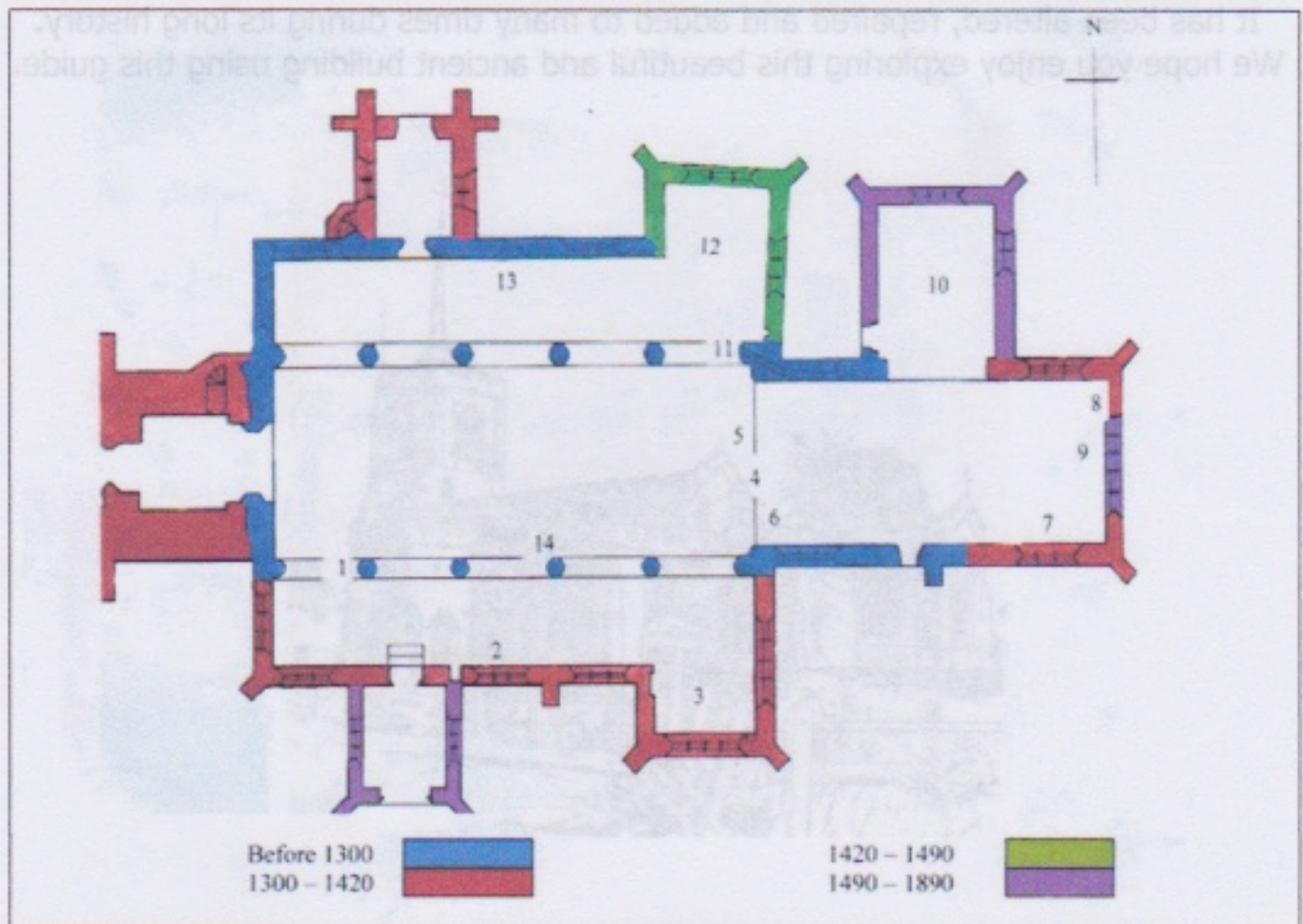


Gamlingay is on the Cambridgeshire/Bedfordshire border with a population of approximately 4,000 living in 1,500 households. The village is steeped in history, with many listed buildings. The stone for building the church was from a quarry within the village which is now called "The Butts". Once dominated by farming and agriculture Gamlingay is now largely a commuter village: 44% of its employed residents work outside of Cambridgeshire.
