

- ◆ Just before we go into the chancel, have a look at the LECTERN(11). This word comes from the Latin word 'lectus' which means 'to read'.

- ◆ Let's have a look at the wooden SCREEN(4). It divides the Nave from the CHANCEL. There used to be a plain cross or 'rood' on top of it which was replaced in the 1980's with the current carving of the crucifixion. The oldest part of the screen was put here in 1480 and the screen was altered when the church was restored in 1880 BUT if you look really closely, you might see traces of the medieval red, green, gold and cream paint!

- ◆ Here's another thing to try to spot! Look to the right of the top of the screen and see if you can spot a bricked up doorway. Found it? Well done! This actually is the top of a small winding staircase called a VICE which led to the top of the screen. We'll find the bottom of the staircase later.

- ◆ One last thing before we go through the screen – look up at the four windows above. These used to have plain glass in them but the beautiful stained glass was inserted in 1910. These are called the APOSTLE WINDOWS and are named after the writers of the four gospels.
