

- ◆ Turn to face the ALTAR which is in the SANCTUARY. This is the most special and sacred part of church and is used at the service of Holy Communion when we share bread and wine to remind us of the Last Supper when Jesus shared bread and wine with his disciples.



- In which direction are you facing?

Look at the altar rail. It is in memory of _____

- ◆ The wooden screen behind the altar is called the REREDOS and was given to the church by the Orlebar family who used to live in Tetworth Hall.
- ◆ One more thing to look at in the chancel before we leave it. Look at the three seats to the right of the sanctuary. These seats are called SEDILIA(7) and are for those people who are leading the services. Just beyond the sedilia is a little basin called the PISCINA.

- What do you think the priest might have washed in the piscina?

- ◆ Turn to retrace your steps back through the rood screen into the nave of the church. Look up to your left and look for the three round shapes above the pillars. These are called 'roundels' and are thought to have come from the original Anglo-Saxon church. Now that IS old!
- ◆ Let's have a look at the PULPIT dating from 1880. Do you remember the vice we mentioned earlier? We can see the remains of the first few steps of this to the side of the pulpit.

- What do you think the pulpit is for?

- ◆ As you walk down the south aisle, look at some of the memorials on the wall until you reach a very long cupboard over 3m long set into the wall.

- What do you think this might have been used for?
